#### **Directions:**

- 2. Make some guesses about possible answers to the research question in section two. Making a guess, or hypothesis, helps test the research results.
- 3. Read down the list of Record Types. Put a mark in the first column if the source dates match your research question. Ex. if searching for a marriage in 1854, marriages license applications won't help because those start in 1885. But religious records and probate records might provide spouses name and/or dates.
- 4. Go through the marked records and do a search. Note the search results under the blank column.
